Our trips will take you through some of the most scenic mountain countryside close to the base of the majestic Livingstone Mountain Range and the rolling grasslands of the Porcupine Hills in Southwestern Alberta.

Step back into the pages of time and experience a taste of the "Old West" as we ride the open ranges, drive cattle, indulge in down home country cooking and tell yarns & sing songs around the campfire. You will marvel at the breath-taking scenery, serenity of nature and the comradeship of fellow horsemen.

Rules & Regulations

- Cabins, bunkhouses, TeePee, and Outfitter's Tent are available for rental (first come first served basis) or camping available
- If camping must supply own accommodation & gear for camping.
- Slickers, warm clothing, cool clothing & suitable riding gear are a must! We ask that everyone wears appropriate western clothing (i.e. Western hats, jackets & boots) sunglasses, sunscreen & bug spray are suggested options.
- No dogs allowed.
- Bring your own horse feed whether it be cubes, grain, or weed free hay if you are supplying your own horse.
- Time in the saddle approx. 5 6 hours/day.
- Age limit of 14 years if accompanied by parent.
- Age limit of 18 years if not accompanied by parent.
- Waivers must be signed by everyone attending.

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Meet & Greet Evening

Guests arrive late afternoon or early evening on the Friday before the Frontier Cattle Drive begins. Everyone is responsible for their supper that evening as everyone arrives at different times due to work schedules, flights, etc. We do however have snacks set out for our orientation and everyone gets to meet all participants. At this time we do have waivers signed and all guests are assigned to their horse and saddle – unless of course they are bringing their own.

Please note that this is only approximate times as each Cattle Drive will depend on how the cattle are moving. The July & Aug Cattle Drives vary a bit in the fact that sometimes we will be riding out from the ranch and at other times we will be trailering the horses out to where we start or stop.

We usually try to have everything wrapped up at bit earlier on the Sunday night as some guests may have to leave to get back to work for the next day. Others may choose to come before the Cattle Drive and some may choose to stay longer – the choice is yours!
